Coral Park Elementary School is a mandatory uniform school. Students will be asked to call home if they are not in uniform to have their parents bring them the appropriate uniform attire. Students are required to wear uniforms to school every day. The selected school uniform options may be purchased from a variety of sources, such as uniform companies, department/retail stores and catalogs. The preferred vendor for school logo and embroidery is:



TOPS: White or navy polo shirts with **embroidered school logo**.

Polo-style dress, in navy and with school logo, is also approved. Selected school T-shirts may be worn only on Fridays.

Jackets and sweaters, **ONLY** in navy; see styles below.

A white polo is required for special occasions/events.

BOTTOMS: Navy or khaki pants, shorts, skirts or skorts at a length just above the knees.

SHOES: Closed toe and back shoes at all times; see approved styles below. **White ankle height socks** are to be worn with approved closed toe shoes.



RESTRICTIONS:

The following articles of clothing are **not permitted**:

- athletic or gym shorts
- leggings
- sweatpants
- capris
- jean/denim fabric
- shoes/laces with lights/sounds
- rings
- long/oval large hoop earrings
- sandals, platform, or wheel/roller shoes
- caps
- visors
- sunglasses
- bandanas
- knee high socks
- large chains or rings

OTHER:

- Tops must be tucked in at all times
- Tops must be in appropriate size and length
- White/ Navy tights may be worn under skirt/skort or polo dress during winter months
- Bottoms must be worn to the waist and accompanied by a belt if skirt or pants have loops

Required for Incoming Pre-K - Grades 3

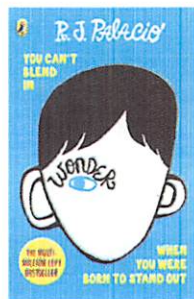
