

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Dear Parents/ Guardians:

As we approach the start of the 2022 holiday season, I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude for your continued dedication and support to our staff, students, and community. Your collaboration is an integral part of our students' academic success.

Additionally, I would like to remind you of the arrival and dismissal procedures shared with you in August 2022. Please carefully review the information below and thank you in advance for your continued support and assistance to ensure that students are dismissed in a safe and orderly manner.

Arrival:

- Supervision is available at 7:45 a.m., at which time students may be dropped off at school. School breakfast is also available at this time.
- Students should be seated and ready to learn no later than 8:20 a.m. for Grades PK -1, and no later than 8:35 a.m. for Grades 2-5.
- Arrival via the car-line drop-off areas, on 97th Avenue and on 12th Street are solely for pass-through, drop-off purposes.
- Staff supervision is available on 97th Avenue and 12th Street to facilitate the process.
- Parents should not park or exit from their vehicles in these areas to help ensure the safety of all students.

Dismissal:

- Dismissal times for grades Pre-K, Kindergarten and Grade 1 is at 1:50 p.m., Monday-Friday.
- Grades 2-5 students are dismissed at 3:05 p.m. daily, except Wednesdays.
- All PreK-Grades 5 students are dismissed at 1:50 p.m. on Wednesdays.
- Students riding a bus are dismissed on 97th Avenue and parent pick-up students are dismissed on 12th Street.
- Parents using the parent pick-up drive-through area are to REMAIN in their vehicles.
- Teachers and staff are stationed in these dismissal areas to assist students and help expedite the dismissal process in a safe and orderly manner.
- Parking or stopping in surrounding streets and/ or sidewalks is strictly prohibited.

Please also be mindful of our neighbors' properties and refrain from parking on their lawns and/ or blocking their driveways. We strive to be good neighbors and value our neighboring community's support of our great school. We need your help to ensure this partnership continues to shine. I thank you in advance for your continued cooperation with these procedures. They have been designed for the safety, security, and well-being of our students, staff, parents, and neighboring school community.
